In Re. Death of Hon. Allen J. Greer

Brethren of the bar.---Since last we met in this Court room the grim reaper has been busy among us and has summoned another of our member to lay aside his business and excuses and appear before the great Tribunal from whose decree no appeal may be taken.

Allen J. Greer was born in Reedsville, Penn. on June 14, 1854. At an early age he became a resident of this County, making Lake City his home and for twenty five years he was one of its prominent citizens, one who was continually honored by his fellow men with positions of trust and responsibility. When but 26 years of age he became Superintendent of Schools and soon after became a member of this bar where he has ever since been a familiar figure. Not only has he been thus identified with the cause of justice here but he has served this state long and well, two terms as a member of the house of representatives and two terms in the state senate.

He died in Monrovia, Cal. on March 14, 1905, and his remains rest in the beautiful City of his adoption whose interest he so zealously served.

He leaves to mourn his loss his widow, his son Donald Greer and a host of friends, both in and out of his profession. In view of the loss we have sustained, your committee desire to move that we do hereby express the deep sense of loss which we feel as individuals in the deportation from one whom we loved. That we recognize the fact that in this death the bar has lost one of its most conscientious members; The Court a faithful helper, this County one of its most distinguished men, and this state a most valuable public servant, and we do move that this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this Court.
