MEMORIAL REGARDING THE DEATH OF E. N. CARD

As E. N. Card, for many years a prominent attorney of this county, passed away since the last session of the Court, we think it appropriate that his eminent and successful practice at this bar should be recognized, and properly brought before the court with the resolutions proffered for S. L. Campbell. As Mr. Card was, during all of the time of his practice here, a contemporary of S. L. Campbell's.

Mr. Card died at the City of Chicago during the summer just passed, and his remains were conveyed to Lake City for burial. He was born in the State of Rhode Island, June 2, 1828. In 1825 his parents moved to Otsego County, New York, where he continuously resided until 1871. He was admitted to the bar at Cooperstown New York, July 1853, entered upon and continued upon the practice of law in that county until 1863, when he was elected to the office of County Judge and surrogate of said county. At the close of his term of office he resumed the practice of law at Cooperstown, which he followed continuously until 1873, when he came to Lake City, opened a law office and practiced in this county for many years.

As an attorney, Mr. Card possessed more than ordinary ability and during his residence in this county conducted a large business, and enjoyed an extensive practice. When he left Lake City for St. Paul, he continued his practice there until advancing age compelled his retirement.
