JOHN H. MULLIN

In behalf of the members of this bar I respectfully present the following memorial and ask that it be accepted by the Court and incorporated into its minutes.

Gen John H. Mullin died at his home in the City of Wabasha, Minnesota, on the 3d day of April 1907, and was buried at Sa__ City on the 5th day of April 1907.

He was born in the north of Ireland on the 16th day of March 1842. His parents had become residents of Mass. and at the time of his birth his mother was at her old home on a visit. When he had reached the age of three months, she rejoined the husband and father in their New England home where he remained until the commencement of the war of the rebellion. On the 23d day of April 1861 he enlisted in the 12th Connecticut and was immediately, with his regiment, sent to the front. He served three years, re-enlisted and served until the close of the war, winning promotion for diligence to duty and bravery in action.

Soon after the close of the war he came to Minnesota and engaged in business. He later entered upon the study of law and in the year 1884 was admitted to the bar, commenced, and continued the practice of that profession until shortly before his death. He served one term as County attorney and at one period of his active life held the responsible position of the Adjutant Gen. of this State.*

He was a man of strong affection, a genial companion, a loving husband and father and his loss is deeply deplored by the members of this bar and by all who knew him.
