HAROLD GOODSIR SIMPSON *

(August 11, 1890 - August 15, 1939)

Harold Goodsir Simpson was born in Minneapolis, August 11, 1890, and died at Lake Minnetonka, August 15, 1939.

He graduated from the public schools of Minneapolis and took his college preparatory work at Hotchkiss School, Lakeville, Conn.

In 1908 he entered the University of Wisconsin. At the end of his sophomore year he left college to enter the mercantile business in southern Idaho. While there he became much interested in a pending suit and studied law in his leisure hours. Sure then that the law was his calling, he returned to Minneapolis and entered the Law Department of the University of Minnesota, from which he graduated in 1916. The next year he entered the aviation service of the U. S. army and received his "wings" shortly before the armistice was signed.

He returned to Minneapolis and took up active practice at once, until failing health compelled him to withdraw.

He was a member of the Sigma Chi fraternity, the Order of the Coif, and the American Legion, being one of the founders of the Theodore Peterson No. 1.
